Duties and Responsibilities:

Except as specifically noted, the following functions are considered essential to this position.

Works on road maintenance crew doing general laboring tasks and performs a variety of other heavy manual work in connection with the maintenance and construction of sidewalks and roads.

Loads and unloads stone, gravels, dirt, asphalt, timber, and heavy mechanical equipment.

Shovels, rakes, and hand rolls asphalt, and mixes cement.

Attaches and removes snow plows and associated equipment from vehicles and assists in plowing snow, salting and sanding operations, or other activities to mitigate conditions caused by extreme weather conditions.

Uses and performs preventative/routine maintenance on hand tools and other machinery which may include, but not be limited to, mowers, brush cutters, chainsaws, weed whackers, etc.

Occasionally performs traffic control functions at job sites.

Familiar with and executes safe work procedures associated with assigned work.

Maintain effective working relationship with other employees and the public.

Operates heavy and light vehicular equipment, if properly licensed.

Availability 24 hours per day to meet emergency situations.

Performs related work as required.
